



STATEMENT

Munich Security Conference, 14-16 February 2025

EPP Women participated in the Munich Security Conference 2025, actively promoting the importance of female involvement in foreign and security policy.

The central theme of MSC 2025 was the growing multipolarity of the world, marked by an increasingly divided international order and rising polarization within states.

EPP Women noted the negative impacts of multipolarity, particularly the deteriorating relations between major powers and the competitive models emerging.

In particular it is clear that the cooperative security architecture in Europe has been destroyed by Russia's war against Ukraine.

EPP WOMEN:

- **stress the need for a strong NATO commitment to defend the sovereignty, independence, and territorial integrity of Ukraine against Russian aggression.**
- **underline that security of the European continent is a collective responsibility, requiring tight cooperation.**
- **is firmly convinced that only a strong NATO alliance can provide the necessary conditions for a peace that benefits both European citizens and the USA.**

The Security System as organized in NATO rightly defends a value-based system in which security is built on democracy and the rule of law, guaranteeing the freedom and security of its citizens. EPP Women fully stand up for these principles of NATO and the EU that ensure security and safety for children, young people, families, and seniors.

We, EPP Women, want a safe Europe, free from disinformation, fake news, and hate speech, and any form of manipulation that would jeopardize the future of the younger generation.

We want a peaceful Europe, achieved through negotiation, where both Europe and Ukraine play an important role, ensuring Ukraine's sovereignty and lasting peace.
